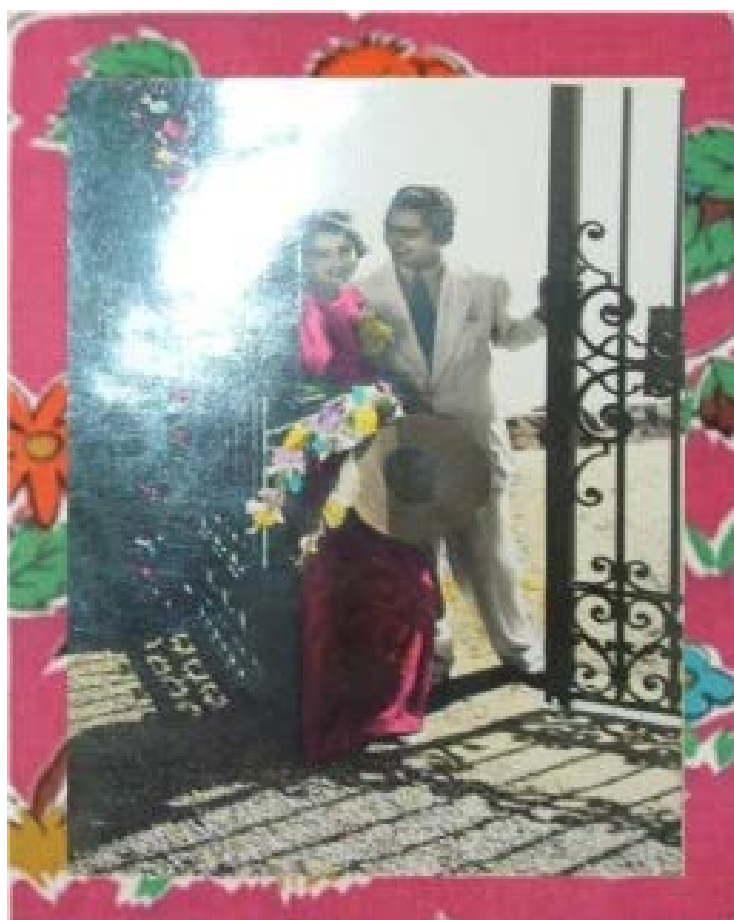
COMING UP

60,000 negatives of South African photographer **Ernest Cole**, which documented Apartheid since the 1950s, were found in a bank vault in Sweden. His collection was believed to be lost, but the photographs are a unique testimony of the Apartheid years in South Africa. More information on the discovery [here](#).



The HMML and the world's religious cultural heritage

The [Hill Museum & Manuscript Library](#) (HMML), located at Saint John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota, holds the world's largest archive of manuscript photographs in both microfilm and digital format. A global cultural organization, HMML's mission is to preserve and share the world's manuscript heritage. The HMML is currently digitizing Christian, Islamic and Persian manuscript collections at 15 fieldwork sites in 10 countries.
