
#### **NEW CONTENT PROVIDERS**



# Rosa Genoni – the woman who conquered the 20<sup>th</sup> Century *Milan, Italy – until the 24th March 2018*

The **Milan State Archives** organised an exhibition dedicated to Rosa Genoni: seamstress, fashion designer, teacher, feminist, and advocate for workers' rights. She was the Italian delegate at the International Congress of Women, The Hague, Netherlands, held on 28 April - 10 May 1915. Her activism efforts along with her desire to make Italy a fashion leader were thwarted under Fascism, but her legacy leaves on. ## Arquivo.pt – grants available to study the Portoguese archived web

Arquivo.pt is the Portuguese Web Archive. It collects and preserves the Portuguese web sphere, and enables search and access to files archived since 1996. Its main objective is the preservation of information published on the Web for research purposes. Web Archives are a real challenge for cultural preservation, but also a more and more important aspects of the archival works. Here you can find a 20' technical description of how the archive work and how the archived websphere is made available to the public (click on the picture below).

Also, applications for the Arquivo.pt Prizes 2018 are now open until the **4<sup>th</sup> of May 2018**. The 1st prize is **10,000 EURO**.

Individual or group applications can be submitted about any theme, the only requirement is to use **Arquivo.pt** as the main source of information. To apply, you will need to submit a text and a short video describing the work done. The use of the Portuguese language is mandatory. However, keep in mind that submissions may be done by a team, so it may just be necessary to to include one Portuguese speaker to fill this requirement.
